

HCCI Essential Elements of Home-Based Primary Care™ Workshop Agenda Orlando, FL – December 2-3, 2021

GOALS AND LEARNING OBJECTIVES

This two-day foundational workshop is designed for learners who are considering or who are relatively new to offering home-based primary care (HBPC) services for patients with complex medical conditions. Through this workshop, clinical providers, practice managers and operations staff will enhance their knowledge, competence, and performance in providing optimal HBPC based on current recommendations from national experts. This workshop features case-based sessions focusing on clinical and economic factors unique to home-based primary care, including patient assessment; medication management; acute/urgent care; infection control; technology useful in enhancing patient care and productivity; cultural competence; staffing, operations, and durable medical equipment; coding and billing; provider safety and self-care.

Upon completion of this workshop, learners will be able to:

- Describe the role of HBPC in various contexts, including Population Health, Public Health, and the developing systems of health care.
- Apply the *4Ms in the Care of Older Adults* to the HBPC population: home-limited patients with multiple co-morbidities.
- Provide optimal patient care in a simulated home setting and demonstrate appropriate coding and documentation for the visit.
- Examine and discuss the business models, economic drivers, and quality indicators for HBPC and their impact on care delivery.
